Incidentally, England will also play three IT20s and 3 ODIs against Australia prior to the tournament starting. And that's just part of one country's schedule! Mark Nicholas pointed out in a recent CricInfo column that there will be three major T20 tournaments taking place in January alone next year, making the suggestion that ODIs should be drastically reduced in number as it will be impossible to stop the T20 franchaise

Personally I hope we will retain our mixture of T20 and longer format games, draws included, although it does seem that the groundswell towards win/lose throughout is growing. ### OVER 40s ROUNDUP

Central Division 1, Sale Silverbacks (with Mark Rowe pictured, hitting the winning runs in their title-clinching game) came out on top, winning nine of their last 10 games to hold off the challenge of Cheadle Hulme and Grappenhall, with Toft finishing fourth on 34 pts. Alderley Edge propped up the rest with Urmston finishing second bottom, despite a big win in their last game.

Central Div 2: Bowdon Vale came out on top in a tight division, finishing 5 pts ahead of the rest, the 3 pts gained from a tie with Warrington on May 4th helping their cause. Ashley were runners-up, finishing two and three pts clear respectively of Woodford and Warrington, whilst Didebury's first foray into over 40s cricket saw the

### WK 16 - AUGUST 6

A major surprise heralded the start of the new month as lowly Toft, without a win in eight games, bundled out Chester BH for just 76 at Booths Park, the visitors losing 8-16 in nine sensational overs as Matthew Cornes and Joe Stanley set up a priceless victory for the hosts, who were made to sweat for almost two hours for the 77 needed, Tom Forster's cool head the key. Fellow strugglers Oxton also picked up 25 pts, their second win in a row courtesy of Joe Mennie (5-30) and then 75\* from Matty Jones as Widnes were overcome. Bottom side Bowdon just avoided defeat at home to Neston. Luke Camden's fine 118 seeing the visitors post 250-6 as Bowdon's last pair survived on 223-9. Brooklands went down by 6 wkts at Didsbury while **Oulton Park** came surprisingly close to ending their 10 match winless streak, at Nantwich of all places. Opting to bat first, skipper Martyn East's brilliant form continued with his third ton of 2022, following up last week's century with a magnificent 114 here before retiring not out with an injury which prevented him bowling. East and Jimmy Sullivan (90) put on 189 for the second wkt as the hosts endured an untypical struggle for a breakthough, OP finishing on 276-6 and then keeping the powerful

Dabbers batting well in check as they finished on 222-8. All of which was great news for Alderley Edge, who again were left indebted to the class of Sam Perry, his knock of 123 taking him (like East) pass 700 league runs for the campaign, and more significantly yielded a 6 wkt triumph over leaders Hyde, Kenshana Fonseka's 79\* the only highlight of a rare off-day for them. AE moved to second in the table with 23 pts separating the top four, and 28 pts the bottom four, at the close of a fascinating match day.

#### **WK 17 - AUGUST 13**

An extraordinary matchday which saw eight centuries recorded, an 8-for, and a tie, saw just one side claim 25 pts. Nantwich were the big winners on a highly unusual day after Luke Robinson made a brilliant 120 (110 bs), putting on 170 with Marcus Stables (82\*) for the 3rd to claim a 7 wkt win at **Brooklands.** Earlier Kevin Carroll had made an amazing 103 off just 57 bs in the hosts' 247. Leaders Hyde gorged themselves with the bat, two players who both had recent spells at Chester BH returning in style, Luke Young batting throughout to make 141\* (146 bs) while Noah Vickery hit 9 sixes and 13 fours in his 138, the pair add-

ing a monumental 255 in 34 overs as Hyde declared on a gargantuan 372-3. CBH were given 59 overs to chase with Alex Money (100) and Rick Moore (88) adding 175 for the 2nd, their stand spanning 40 overs as CBH finished 265-6. Didsbury seemed to have everything under control at Oxton as the hosts fell to 58-8, but a remarkable 58\* from no.10 Jack Corran and patience from Jordan Collier saw 92 runs added for the 9th, Nick Anderson (8-39) finally ending it, Oxton 150. Despite plenty of starts, Dids could not get going and at 104-7 were staring at defeat, but the lower order fought hard to bring the scores level. Joe Mennie then took two in two balls, both sides getting 16 pts for the tie. Alderley Edge were held to a low scoring draw at **Bowdon**, **Archie** Vaughan's 78 the standout inns, while Widnes' Luke McCoy (117) and Matt Burns (105) put on 232 as they racked up 305-5 against Neston, who were in desperate trouble at 68-6 before Luke Jones (101) marshalled the tail, the last six overs all maidens as Neston clung on to draw, 227-9. Oulton Park had the better of their game with Toft but were left frustrated as Toft finished 190-8 in reply to 268-9.

Stockport Georgians took a major step towards Div 1 cricket next year with a straightforward 8 wkt win over lowly Warrington, who themselves remain in deep relegation mire after a sobering day in which they were never in the contest. The two skippers were the decisive figures in the Warrington innings, Ashley Scholes with 54 as James Locke claimed 5-58. Ned Bailey (64\*) and Francis Yates (45\*) then added an unbroken 93 as SG won with more than half their overs unused. Their mood was further lifted when news came through of Romiley's draw in a penurious struggle at Port Sunlight. ### WK 16 - AUGUST 6

North East Cheshire comfortably defeated Oakmere by 66 runs to take a significant step towards promotion. Saul Gould hit 96 and Dave Oldfield took 4 more wkts as the leaders won by 66 runs. Their nearest pursuers Maritime lost out by 4 runs in a thriller at third place Hawk Green, after Jack Needham (50) and last pair Sam Clarke (34\*) and Jake Skelton (10\*) added 60 for the last two wickets to lift HG to 190-9. Maritime were four sheets to the wind at 45-6 but no.8 Pratham Shetty (65\*) marshalled a brilliant recovery with the tail, the last pair adding 24 until, in unbearable tension, last man Vishal Barigela was caught with five runs needed. The result left HG four pts behind Maritime in the table, with **Stockport** just one point behind and closing fast after a fourth win in five, this one an 8 wkt hammering of Runcorn who could only cobble together 82 and departed Cale Green pointless. Tattenhall had the rare but sweet taste of victory to savour after defeating near-neighbours Barrow in a close run thing at The Flacca. Tattenhall were bowled out for an underwhelming 120 but produced a magnificent fighting response as

Barrow were dismissed for 101, unable to get any fluency going and suffering the unusual fate of having a player (Zak Rogers) dismissed for obstructing the field. The win lifted Tattenhall out of the relegation zone at Runcorn's expense, with Winnington Park also gaining a little breathing space after an unusual win over Ashley. WP could only muster 93, and when Ashley cruised to 49-1 in the 20th it seemed just a matter of time. Andrew Jackson (4-18) and in particular Mark Hamblett had other ideas, though, as he returned figures of 10.2-6-5-5, Ashley losing 9 wkts for just 19 runs in an astonishing collapse. In the other game, Kingsley kept themselves just in touch with the promotion picture after a 78 run win over Barnton, whose relegation is one step closer to being formally confirmed.

Having been on the end of

an agonising defeat the week previous, second place Maritime had the boot on the other shoe with a 1 wkt win over Tattenhall. In a remarkable match, Vishan Barigela and Vensakar Kanthiraj shared 9 wkts for 67 runs as Tatt were all out 140. Maritime were five down in the blink of an eve before Joseph Mikel Akeem came to the crease and smote an unbelievable 102\* from just 61 balls although wickets continued to fall, Akeem just doing enough to get his side home. Naveed Gondal made 86\* as Stockport continued their good form with a 2 wkt win over Winnington Park. At the bottom, Runcorn's huge 211 run win over **Barnton** (Will Magee 101\*) saw them clamber out of the relegation spots for now, while Barnton's demotion will be mathematically confirmed next week if they fail to win. Tattenhall and Runcorn meet in early September with both sides facing tough games in the run-in.

Oxton and Cheadle drew their mid-table clash, while two of the bottom three at the start of play drew, Hyde's Liam Grindlay making 110 off 97 bs in their chunky 255-9 against Alderley Edge, who replied with an indeterminate 173-5. Struggling Bowdon meantime picked up a priceless 25 pts with a 5 wkt win at Neston to stir the pot further at the foot of the table.

Ahead of T20 Finals Day, **Chester** and Didsbury picked up 25 more pts each on Aug 13 as their title tussle stayed as it was, **Chester BH** beating **Alderley Edge** while **Didsbury** were indebted to a battling 60 from **Sam Youds** to secure a 3 wkt triumph over a determined

Oxton side with just 7 deliveries remaining. Bollington had hopes of successive wins after they had seen Davenham slide from 31-0 to 88. winning by 8 wkts), having Hale Barns 135-5, but an amazing 95\* from no.7 Fisal Nasir (in concord with Tom Entwistle) took HB to 277-5, and despite Jake Dickinson making 116, Bolly were all out 249 after a gutsy chase in which Nasir took 6-54. The upshot is that just 8 pts separate three of the bottom four as Bollington and Urmston meet next Saturday in a pivotal clash.

It was even more emphatic on Sat for the Cale Green side with a 10 wkt win over 68 all out Upton. Haslington beat Tattenhall by 7 wkts. Lymm OP are 15 pts behind in third, their whacking 104 run win over Oakmere on the 6th being tempered by defeat at Chester BH on Sat, the victors themselves now fourth, just 3 pts behind Lymm! One point further back are Ashley, held at Runcorn on Sat after clambering to a nervous norvus 2 wkt win at Irby the week before, Dan Barlow's 85-ball 14\* inching them home. Four clubs will battle to avoid the drop but it is looking bleak for Mobberley, 43 pts away from safety.
