A very busy month of cricket has flown by and it has been such a pleasant change not to be reporting on rounds of weather blighted spells, most notably the virtual washout on Sunday 5th, but it has otherwise been remarkably dry, if lacking in real warmth at times. It's also been good to enjoy some fantastic international cricket during the month too - whether you were astonished by the incredible hitting of the England ODI team in Holland or equally amazed by the exhilarating second Test at Trent Bridge in particular, there's been much to enjoy. I have been of the view for some time now that matches be-

tween England and New Zealand are the most watchable on the international circuit - certainly if I was going to pay money to watch two teams, it would be them. And that's as much to do with the spirit in which the games between the two are played. Some of you will remember the 2008 ODI the two played at The Oval, when Ryan Sidebottom (bowler) accidentally collided with Grant Elliott (batter) as a tight run in a very close game was attempted. Both players were left sprawling on the turf, the ball returned to the bowlers' end where the helpless Elliott matches. Yes, there have been wet was run out. The England captain at the time, Paul Collingwood, insisted he wanted the appeal to stand, which led to widespread booing. The NZ players reacted angrily and their delight when they won off the last ball was extraordinary. Collingwood was (much later) to admit he got caught up in the desire to win and got his decision wrong. The Spirit of Cricket was definitely not in the mix on that occasion! Things slowly improved after that and the 2019 World Cup Final became all the more memorable because of the spirit in which it was played. And I'm not just thinking about the inci-

dent involving Ben Stokes and overthrows either - there was a moment before that when Stokes hit a lofted drive and Trent Boult, leaping high close to the boundary edge, caught the ball but stumbled backwards, his foot just catching the boundary cushion a split-second before he released the ball to Martin Guptill, who completed the 'catch'. Guptill, however, immediately and without hesitation signalled 'six' to the umpire, a gesture I have never forgotten. At such a crucial moment, in the biggest game, one player chose to make the umpires' job easier. No matter that TV replays could have been consulted - in that moment Martin Guptill captured the Spirit of Cricket perfectly, and ever since that game, the two sides play in a wonderfully competitive but sporting way. It's because of this that you will see a focus on the spirit of the game in this and future issues of the newsletter, looking at what we can all do to ensure that, whatever our involvement, we can all embody this same Spirit and make our game better and stronger.

### THE SPIRIT OF CRICKET

### Often the subject of animated debates, the 'spirit of cricket' is best defined as **choosing to play fairly**. The preamble to the laws makes for an interesting statement and is worthy of an airing here:

Cricket owes much of its appeal and enjoyment to the fact that it should be played not only according to the Laws, but also within the Spirit of Cricket. The major responsibility for ensuring fair play rests with the captains, but extends to all players, match officials and, especially in junior cricket, teachers, coaches and parents.

- Respect is central to the Spirit of Cricket.
- Respect your captain, team-mates, opponents and the authority of the umpires.
- Play hard and play fair.
- Accept the umpire's decision.
- Create a positive atmosphere by your own conduct, and encourage others to do likewise.
- Show self-discipline, even when things go against you.
- Congratulate the opposition on their successes, and enjoy those of your own team.
- Thank the officials and your opposition at the end of the match, whatever the result.
- Cricket is an exciting game that encourages leadership, friendship and teamwork, which brings together people from different nationalities, cultures and religions, especially when played within the Spirit of Cricket.

If every game of cricket was played according to these principles, what would our match day experience be like? Many clubs across Cheshire work hard on embodying the spirit of cricket in ways described above and this can only be welcomed in growing the game.

#### Captains & Umpires

There are two specific statements within the laws that specify where responsibility for upholding the 'spirit of cricket' applies. This is primarily with the team captain:

Law 1.4 Responsibility of captains: *The captains are* responsible at all times for ensuring that play is conducted within The Spirit of Cricket as well as within the Laws. See The amble – The Spirit of Cricket and Law 41.1 (Fair and unfair play).

But umpires also have a key role in this regard:

#### Law 41.2: Unfair Actions

The umpires shall be the sole judges of fair and unfair play. If an umpire

considers that any action by a player, not covered in the Laws, is unfair, they shall call and signal Dead ball, if appropriate, as soon as it becomes clear that the call will not disadvantage the non-offending side, and report the matter to the other umpire.

So in essence, umpires hold captains to account in terms of playing within the law as written but also within the spirit implied. After a match this is reflected in the marking done by umpires of the captain and the team, and also the marks submitted by the captains that give their view on how the umpires performed.

#### WK 7 - JUNE 4


Six winners on the first day of June, the biggest of whom were **Toft**, who made it three on the bounce after a 211 run demolition of Brooklands. Rob Jones' great form continued with 97 and James Scott made a spectacular return with 25 off 13 and 4-1 as the hosts collapsed from 43-3 to 62 all out. Nantwich were also big winners, their 122 run win at Oxton a welcome boost after a barren May. No batter passed 50 but their 225-7 proved more than enough after the hosts were quickly in the doo-doo at 16-4, eventually all out 103, 4 wkts apiece for Jimmy Warrington and Phil Stockton. A 130 run stand between Warren Goodwin (74) and Lee Dixon (54) gave Chester BH the platform to overtake Alderley Edge's 152, while leaders Didsbury suffered a second reverse of the season, going down by 4 wkts at **Neston** after **Simon Stokes'** 87\* helped the hosts recover from 95-5 and reach their 203 target with 8 balls remaining, Sam Youds having earlier made 72 for the visitors. Hyde moved back to second after a spectacular knock from Andrew Jackson (94\* off 51 bs) turned a wobbly 78-4 into a comfortable 196-4 and victory at Oulton Park, his stand with George Balderson (50\*) worth 116\*. No lack of fight from bottom club Bowdon but it was to be a fifth defeat in six at Widnes, Kieran Maher making 81 in the hosts' 4 wkt win.

#### WK 9 - JUNE 18

Hyde had to work harder than they might have expected to surpass Oxton's 165 at Townfield Rd (Danny Cranmer 6-34) but Tom Partridge's 63 anchored their successful chase to keep them top. Didsbury kept in touch with a brilliant win at Widnes after four of the hosts' top five batters passed 40, Widnes making 247-6. Dids were flagging at 130-6 after 34 but skipper Nick Anderson (84\*) rallied the lower order, Dids winning by 2 wkts in the 54th over. Much more straightforward for resurgent Nantwich, who won by 7 wkts at Bowdon. The hosts batted one ball shy of their allocation but were restricted to 144, the four man Dabbers' attack bowling 20 maidens. Luke Robinson (62\*) and Spencer Byatt (36\*) added an unbroken 94 as Nantwich won inside 28 overs. Chester BH won in similar fashion at Brooklands, their 6 wkt win attained in 27.1 overs with Harry Killoran (who didn't bowl) making the match top score of 42\*. Neston's batting fired well at Toft, an opening stand of 88 between Luke Camden (89\*) and Jamie Wilson (60) setting up an 8 wkt win after Rowan Shelton took 6-67. Despite Martyn East's fine form continuing, his 63 was the only major contribution as Oulton Park's mini-slump went on, losing 7-27 as Alderley Edge's Ed Foster's 5-31 saw them all out 149. Foster then added 52 for the first wkt with Sam Perry (60\*) to set up a 7 wkt win.

#### WK 10 - JUNE 25

**Hyde** made it a perfect June with a comprehensive (and rapid) win over **Neston**, the visitors were bowled out for just 132. **Tom Partridge** (51\*) and **Luke Young** (55) hit 19 boundaries between them as Hyde won inside 15 overs. **Nantwich**, by contrast, had to wait until the 54th over to reach their victory target in a gripping clash with **Widnes**, for whom **Kieran Maher** (84) and **Alex Hewitt** (79) added 121 for the 5th wkt before **Qamar Hafiz** hit 6 sixes in a 14-ball 39 to set the Dabbers 269. **Ben Wright** (93) and **Rajiv Kumar** (88) put on 151 for the 4th wkt to set up a terrific win sealed by **Olly Griffiths** hitting 6-2-6, Nantwich making up for a winless May with four in a row in June. **Chester BH** likewise had a much better month with a peculiar 3 wkt win over fading **Oxton**, who recovered from 27-7 to a modest 110. CBH were also in a fine how-do-you-do at 78-7 but got home. 90



#### WK 8 - JUNE 11

With half of the day's matches being drawn, Hyde moved to the top after a terrific hundred from opener Tom Partridge, whose unbeaten 115 (108 bs) enabled his side to survive a late burst of 3 wkts in 4 balls from AJ Hart and complete a 5 wkt win over Brooklands, who somewhat disappointingly folded for 185 after being 90-0. Marcus Stables was another centurion, his brilliant 156\* the feature of Nantwich's massive 306-6 against visitors Neston. Chris Simpson made 76 as the pair added 174 for the 2nd wkt before Jimmy Warrington got to work, his 5-44 the standout as Neston were dismissed for just 122, four players each making 24. Widnes were the surprise winners of the day, pulling off a 43 run win at Alderley Edge after making a modest-looking 196-9 (James McCoy 67). The powerful AE top order then all fell cheaply as Qamar Hafiz (5-39) did the damage with an excellent spell, AE all out 153. A 46-ball knock of 77 from skipper Nick Anderson saw Didsbury post 248-8 against lowly Bowdon, whose last pair defied the hosts for some three overs to claim a draw on 194-9. It was a similar tale at Filkins Lane as OP's Andrew Dufty (who earlier took 4-84) batted out with the last man to hold off Chester's push for a win after they totalled 271-8. 60s' from Martyn East & Rob Sehmi seemed to have got OP into a good position but the rest of the batting fell away, saved by the last-gasp defiance. Minus Rob Jones, Toft managed a healthy 258-8 with 70s from Ewan Williams and James Scott, who then took 4-48 as visitors Oxton finished on 163-8.

from Sam Leech was the standout in Didsbury's 266 at Alderley Edge, but a well paced chase led by Sam Perry (91) and Richard Wilkinson (61) saw the hosts to a 5 wkt win in the 52nd over. Brooklands enjoyed their first trip to Oulton Park, recording the highest total of the season so far in the Prem as Todd Walker (104) and Kevin Carroll (113\* off 53 bs, 11x4, 8x6) helped the visitors soar to 317-5. A punchdrunk OP regrouped effectively and batted out at 236-8, Rab Nawaz claiming 5-57, but they are now winless in five matches. 84 from Rob Lord and 60s from Tom Graham and Jack Tipton got Bowdon upto 270-5 at Toft. A superb 117 from Henry Hughes led the Toft reply but 24 needed off the last 3 proved beyond them, the match drawn.


#### WK 7 - JUNE 4

No stopping Cheadle, who hammered Timperley by 109 runs at Stockport Rd after another confident display. Liam Fitzpatrick made 92\* and Elliott Bullock 61 as Cheadle's 247-4 proved far too many for the hosts to chase. Abhishek Kulkarni falling third ball and no batter passing 40 as Timperley were all out 138. An entertaining fixture at Sale saw the hosts chase down Marple's 236-6 with some 12 overs in hand, Pat Ashling's fine form in 2022 continuing with 101 as Sale made light work of a testing-looking total set up largely by Mark Bennett (99\*) and Jack Grundy (44) who put on 119 for the 6th wkt after Tyrone Lawrence (5-46) had reduced Marple to 116-5 before blasting 41 off 25 to help set up the Sale charge. Another player enjoying a fine season is Congleton spinner John Copeland, his 4-28 at Bramhall restricting the hosts to 174-8, which looked like it might be enough as Congleton teetered at 103-6, but skipper Jack Goode (53\*) put together a 72 run stand with Muhammad Kashif to secure a fourth win of 2022. Jack Massey's 81 was the bedrock for Macclesfield to claim bragging rights over neighbours **Bollington**, whose difficult season shows no signs of changing after this 64 run loss, Massey also taking two wkts while veteran John Birchall (5-30) enjoyed his afternoon. Lindow also continued to find life tough after being reduced to 16-5 in pursuit of Grappenhall's 174, with only a late riposte from Ryan O'Brien (56 batting at 9) delaying their eventual 45 run defeat. With 64 and 4-30, Ed Barnes enjoyed a fine match for Grappers. A low key match at Alvanley saw visitors Urmston bowled out for just 108, (Sam Mallows 5-45) Alv's third win of the campaign achieved with little fuss.

WK 9 - JUNE 18 It seems somehow altogether wonderfully typical of cricket that a side without a win all season and who have struggled to put totals together should get their first 25 pts of 2022 by chasing down 252 in some style. That was the target set by Marple for Bramhall, Mark Bennett's fantastic 111 their centerpiece. Ashley West was promoted to open and he responded with a superb 101, an opening stand of 141 with Greg Dixon (55) setting the stage for Nick Cantello (59\*) to hit the winning runs. Leaders Cheadle kept their momentum going with an untidy 4 wkt at Congleton after they were set 141, and ended the day 31 clear of Grappenhall, who won by 3 wkts at Timperley after they chased 195 with some three overs in hand - the 29 extras Timpers conceded a significant factor. Sale recorded a third straight win after a terrific match against Alvanley, who posted 255-4, Jarryd Basson 82, Simon Gee 79\* (58 bs). In a thrilling chase Sale dealt with the threat of Sophie Ecclestone (2-71) effectively, Pat Ashling's 74 anchoring things as all the batters made double figures, victory secured with two balls remaining. Another high scoring game at the Rec, where visitors Urmston batted brilliantly to knock off 235 in 41 overs after rain reduced their allocation of overs. Harry Singh had a great match, following up 3-59 with an unbeaten 95 as Rick Hough's 103 for Bolly proved to be in vain.

#### WK 10 - JUNE 25

**Grappenhall's** decisive victory over **Cheadle** saw them close the gap at the top of the table. **Grant Hodnett** top scored with 66 as Grappers made 227-8, which proved enough for a 110 run as the visitors batting had a real off day. **Sale** rounded off a good month with a curious draw at **Bollington**; all six of the Sale top order made double figures (**James Dodds** 68) in their 246-5, Bolly replying with 222-4, keeper **James Longhorn** reaching a unbeaten ton in the final over of the game. **Timperley** won a high scoring game at **Marple**, who had three batters make half centuries in their 264-4, but 71 from **Viraj Sorathia** in a brisk opening stand of 96 set Timpers on their way to an excellent 4 wkt in the 48th over. 53 from



WK8 - JUNE 11 Cheadle recovered from their T20 loss with another good win on the road, 76 from Elliot Bullock and 55\* from Josh Dooler taking them to a round 200 at Urmston, who they then bowled out for 155. News of Marple's loss cheered the Kingsway side yet further as Lindow recorded a heartening first league win in Div 1, by 6 wkts at Bowden Lane. The hosts were dismissed for 157, losing 4 wkts for 2 runs after being 42-0. Rob Herriot (65) and Ryan O'Brien (75) then put things into context with a 126 opening stand which effectively settled the outcome. Sale were the biggest winners of the day, after 100 from Dan Newton took them to 219-9 against Macclesfield. Newton (3-16) then starred with the ball as Macc tumbled to 83 all out. **Timperley** won a thriller at **Congleton** after the home side made 221-7 (Tom Leese 74, Jack Higginbotham 51\*). Despite 69\* from Nathan Brown, Timpers looked to be adrift at 120-7, but a fine effort by the tail helped them seal a memorable win with two balls remaining. Disappointment for the bottom two sides who both lost, Bollington by 4 wkts at Alvanley after making a curious 187 -3 from their allocation (Rick Hough 79), while Bramhall went down heavily at Grappenhall, losing by 8 wkts after being bowled out for 140. A stand of 118 for the 3rd wkt (Grant Hodnett 56\*, Albert Pennington 54\*) giving the hosts a comfortable 25 pts.

Lee Ainsworth and 58 from Chris Charles took Alvanley to 227-7, but visitors Lindow were inspired by Max Law (93) and Johan Wessels (82) who added 124 in 25 overs to set up a splendid 5 wkt win. Congleton enjoyed another visit to Urmston, bowling the hosts out for 158 and then recovering from losing both openers for ducks to graft out a hard fought victory in the 49th over. Nick Cantello hit 109 for Bramhall at Victoria Rd as they posted a healthy 245-8, Macclesfield building up some late momentum after 50s from Jack Mattson & Rob Porter, but leaving it too late to push for victory and finishing 215-5.

Another terrific psp, this time for the 2nd wkt between Seb Botes (96) and Dan Cooke (77) saw 151 added to leave NB needing 44 off the last 5 with 7 wkts in hand, but great bowling by Jones and Johnny Crick (4-44) ensured just one boundary came as Oxton held on. There was an even greater surprise at Werneth Low where Div 2 Port Sunlight beat Premier Div leaders Hyde by 69 runs, even more so when PS were bowled out for just 146 with some 10 overs unused. A dreadful start by the visitors, who lost a wkt to the first ball of the match and were soon 4-2, was tempered only slightly by skipper Simon Melberzs (49) and Wayne Greve (43), Danny Cranmer's 4-24 the pick of a good bowling display as Hyde looked set to progress comfortably. However, a sensational passage of play saw four of the Hyde top five out for 0 as they were left reeling at 2-4, and when top scorer Tom Partridge was run out they were 55-7, PS sealing a famous win when Steve Graham (3-7) took the last wkt, Matthew Hodgson, who did much of the

early damage, taking 4-26. Two rain affected matches early in the month saw two Premier Div sides depart, **Toft** beaten by **Bowdon** in a 20 over game after **Henry Hughes'** 62 off 45 was surpassed by **James Teasdale's** 66\* off 32 incl, 6 sixes. **Timperley's** batting really fired as they took 152 off 17 overs in the second half of their 34 over allocation against **Didsbury**. More rain left Dids 16 overs to chase a revised 141 but they could only manage 119-8 as **Nathan Brown** returned 7-14. **Urmston** & **Alderley Edge** also played a 20 over evening game, **Sam Perry's** 85\* (61 bs) the decisive factor in AE's 16 run win while **Oulton Park's** loss at **Elworth** on the 19th continued a poor run for the Prem team. 68 from the in-form **Martyn East** in an opening stand of 86 promised much, but all 10 wkts went for a further 75,

Stephen Morgan (4-21) the pick of an Elworth attack that all took wkts. East then took 3-30 as OP made the hosts fight hard for the win which was achieved with 11 balls remaining.





Cheshire's up and down 50 over campaign ended in disappointment when they lost to Suffolk at Didsbury (pictured above) on Sunday and thus missed out on qualification from their group. It compounded the pain of losing out in the semi-finals of the T20 competition earlier in the season, when despite a number of really impressive performances, they just fell short. The 50 over competition started with a heavy defeat to eventual group winners Cambridgeshire, who racked up 391-7, Cheshire replying with 294, a total which would have won guite a number of games. A fortnight later Cheshire bounced back with an excellent win over Norfolk at Chester BH, an unbeaten 103 (70 bs) from Will Evans guiding the team to their 249 target inside 43 overs. Then, the following Sunday, Cheshire travelled to Wem to take on Shropshire, captain Rob Sehmi making a second half century in consecutive games as his team won by 4 wkts, to leave their fate in their own hands in the crucial game against Suffolk. The visitors had no hesitation in opting to bat first on a wonderful surface and Ben Clavdon, a Northants contracted player, hit a superb 123, adding 137 for the 4th wkt with

Alex Oxley to put Suffolk in a very strong position, the board showing 207-3 in the 39th. Nick Anderson and Luke Young led the fightback, however, Suffolk all out 304 in the 49th while still a daunting total, it should have been much more, and Cheshire replied confidently with Rob Sehmi again looking in great touch, the hosts looking strong at 131-2 in the 22nd when disaster struck. Alex Money hit a powerful on-drive straight down the pitch, which deflected off the bowler's boot and onto the non-striker's stumps with Sehmi (73 off 64 bs) stranded. Suffolk were jubilant and two more wkts in the next two overs tipped the balance heavily in their favour, the lower order succumbing to the pressure of a rapidly rising run rate. Everyone connected with the club was understandably dejected - after so many miles on the road, and recovering from such a pummelling from the Cambs batters first up, Cheshire had done so well to get into the position they did, just running out of steam. Selection shortages had not helped. Cheshire using 19 players across the four games and with a number of key bowlers not regularly available, they were left wondering what might have been. The 3 day competition comes next, starting with a game on July 3-5 at Alderley Edge, (normally a favourable ground for Cheshire) Oxfordshire the opposition.

Nantwich are the sole team flying the Cheshire flag after their 64 run win over St.Asaph on Sun 19th, Marcus Stables (58) and Rajiv Kumar (49) adding 111 for the 4th to take them to 207, which proved more than enough as they bowled out their opponents for 143. Nantwich, who memorably reached the final in 2019, are now into the last 16. After a fine win at Knowle & Dorridge (pictured left) on the 12th, Didsbury lost out at heavyweights Porthill Park the following week, going down by 64 runs in an entertaining match.
