Everyone remembers the miracle of Headingley 2019, when one of the great Test innings, by Stokes himself, set up an incredible win in the most stylish (and dramatic) way imaginable - but who remembers the overall result of the series? The powers-that-be have gone into overkill mode with interna-

tional cricket - Ashes series that used to be so savoured because of their once-every-four-years cycle are now so common as to almost merge into one. So let's be thankful for an England captain that is indeed dead set on making Test Cricket memorable and enjoyable. ### TURNING BACK TIME - PT 4 2013 CHAMPIONS TROPHY

I'd never been to Cardiff before I travelled there for the start of the Champions Trophy proper, so it was a real journey of discovery. The Millennium Stadium, on the site of the old Arms Park, is right in the centre of the city, and the cricket ground, Sofia Gardens, although much changed over the years, is still on its original site too. I got there late on Monday evening ahead of a practice game between India and Australia the following day, and was allowed to look all round the ground to get my bearings. The media centre was much smaller than at Edgbaston and I met several of the team working there, who were all intensely busy staring at screens, as they were throughout the practice game (India won easily after skittling Aus for 65, so my stats were in demand for the excited throng of journos), and two days later we were in for the real thing! India played South Africa on a beautiful day and, as I was to learn, whenever India play, there is serious interest. Even through plate glass the roars when the Indian team just warm up were noticeable, and when Sharma and Dhawan added 127 it was delirium. And that's before Kohli appeared! The Indian journalists were as excited as the fans - I learned of the numbers of requests re-



ceived by the team from 'journalists' working for spurious publications basically trying to blag their way in! Both sides scored over 300 on a fantastic day and I just about kept up, but





remember being exhausted at the end of it. But no time to rest as it was off to London for the Pakistan/West Indies match the following day. Another first time ground, but unlike Cardiff, I have never been back to The Oval since that day and haven't missed it in all honesty. The media centre, being low down directly behind the pitches, has darkened glass, dimmed lighting and a low ceiling, so not only can you not see a scoreboard from in there, it looks permanently gloomy and feels

quite oppressive. The noise and joy of the Pakistan fans helped lift the mood, although their team, as is their wont, got themselves into a hole and almost dug themselves out before jumping back in feet first, losing by 2 wkts! But I did a good job with a low scoring game before heading home, then back to Cardiff, for a match I will never forget.

A day of fine weather enabled all the last 16 ties to be played, most of which came to a predictable conclusion, with seven Premier Division sides in the quarter finals. High-flying Div 1 side Sale make up the last eight, with Pat Ashling's 86 (58 bs) giving his side a total which proved some 46 runs out of reach of Div. 2 Port Sunlight. Sale's reward is a trip to one of last year's semifinalists **Hyde**, who won a watchable clash at **Timperley** by 29 runs. Put in, four of the top five passed 25 as Hyde - aided by 31 extras - totalled 185-8. In reply Timpers lost **Jonathan Fletcher** first ball but recovered through skipper Ed Galley (39 off 19). But the asking rate kept climbing despite Shahnawaz Khan's 57\* (28 bs), Hyde skipper **Danny Cranmer** rounding off a good personal display with 4-6 (including 3 wkts in 4 balls) to go with his earlier 25. Holders Alderley Edge came through a tricky tie at **Brooklands**, winning by 5 wkts after Dan Fesmer's 4-27 helped them restrict the hosts to 135-8. Despite losing Ben Kohler-Cadmore first ball, AE chipped away with Tom Foreman's 23-ball 45 the standout, seeing his side through with 8 balls to spare. Standing in the way of a third successive finals day appearance for AE will be **Grappenhall**, who pulled off perhaps

the result of the night after beating Premier Division leaders Neston by 5 wkts. Adam Roylance's 52 in a stand of 61 for the 2nd with Kieran Lawton (37) helping their side to a victory target of 126 in the 17th over, after Neston had struggled for fluency, Chris Hackett's 33\* one of only two inns where the strike-rate surpassed 100. Another of last year's semi-finalists Nantwich progressed through, they being the highest scorers of the night as they took 200-4 off Oulton Park. Marcus Stables (54 off 28) and Chris Simpson (47 off 39) set a platform for Spencer Byatt (22\*) and Jake Pearson (24\*) to take 67 off the last 5 overs. Ollie Law (85 off 51 incl. 6x6 and 6x4) led a spirited reply but once he fell in the 17th over, OP couldn't match the late Nantwich firepower. They will face Toft (pictured above) who pulled off a fine win over Chester BH, Rohan Fernando (44\*) and Ewan Williams (24\*) putting on 65 together to take their side over the line. Elsewhere Widnes defended 134 at Div 1 leaders Bowdon, overseas player Eric Botha (31\* off 19) giving their inns a later turbo-charge before taking 2 in 2 as 4 wkts went in 7 balls to scupper Bowdon hopes. They travel to Cheadle who beat Stockport Georgians in a low-scoring game at Kingsway, reaching their 119 target in the 19th over.

#### **WK 9 - JUNE 17**

Sensational wins for the bottom two really grabbed the attention on a baking hot day. Winless since the opening day, **Toft** would have been fearing the worst after **Alderley Edge** called a halt with five overs unused and a daunting 269-6 on the board, after 77 from **Subhaan Mahmood**, 56 from **Sam Perry**, and Lancs keeper **George Bell** chipping in with 37 from 28. But Toft kept their nerve brilliantly, **Jimmy O'Sullivan** batting some 42 overs for his 96 which held things together as his partners all contributed (every Toft batter reached double figures), a heroic victory attained six down in the 56th over. Meanwhile, at Filkins Lane, **AJ Hart** (right)



was the architect of the finest win in **Brooklands** recent history, his 6-38 dismantling a strong **Chester BH** batting line up who were 66-9 before a carefree 42\* from **Jack Williams** took them to 103. Williams then took an early wkt but an 11-ball 39\* from **Kevin Carroll** secured a superb 25 pts. At the top, a hard-fought 2 wkt win for **Neston** took them clear of rivals **Didsbury**, **Ash Davis** again to the fore with 5-80 as Dids did well to make 210 after being 86-6. That looked like a winning total as Neston slipped to 176-8 but Davis came to the rescue with the bat, his 26\* in an unbroken 37 stand for the 9th taking Neston to a 7th win of the season. **Hyde** kept pace although they were pushed hard by **Cheadle**, who batted their full 55 overs to make 182-9, the **Dooler** brothers (**Adam** 62, **Josh** 41) the main contributors. An equally plucky effort in the field actually had Hyde 93-5 and then 138-6, but **Andrew Jackson** (42\* from 13 bs) joined **Ben Balderson** (61\*) to ruthlessly squash Cheadle hopes. A fourth win in a row for **Nantwich** came as **Mitchell Spencer's** 5-53 led their attack to bowl out **Widnes** for 153, **Spencer Byatt** (47\*) and **Luke Robinson** (46 off 29) guiding them hope and consigning the Beaconsfield Rd side to a fifth straight loss. An opening stand of 135 between skipper **Luke Filer** (75) and **Henry Dobson** (117\*) set **Oxton** up for an exciting 7 wkt win over **Grappenhall**, Grappers' competitive looking 237-8 largely courtesy of **Ben Bodha** (60\*). Oxton needed 14 off the last over, **Jordan Collier** (31\* after an earlier 4-69) hitting the penultimate ball for six to give his side a fifth win in six matches.

### **WK 10 - JUNE 24**

A day of remarkable results saw the table roughly split into three, with the top and bottom both covered by a handful of points. Cheadle's win over leaders **Neston** by a convincing 93 runs was the standout, Andrej Yaksender's 114 (113 bs) the mainstay of their splendid 274-6, well supported by his colleagues. A strong Neston side were soon 11-3 in reply and despite solid resistance from the middle order led by David Hurst's 59. four more wkts for Will Holmes wrapped up victory in the 52nd. That meant 81 pts in a splendid June for the Kingsway side. Toft also had a great day, making it successive 25 pt hauls after winning at **Brooklands** by 88 runs. Asked to bat, Toft went from 31-0 to 39-3, but a stand of 127 between O'Shay Reddy (79) and the returning James Scott (51) gave Toft the impetus to climb to 256-8, Brooklands missing the talismanic AJ Hart. Matt

Cornes than had a day of days as he caused early mayhem with two wkts in his second over, Brooklands quickly 15-3. Kevin Carroll (78 off 55) led a typically fiesty response but he became the last of three wkts in four balls for Cornes, who finished with 7-34 as Toft passed the 100 pt mark (having taking zero pts in 3 of their 10 matches). Another side turning it on when it mattered were Chester BH, who emphatically ended a run of four straight losses with a splendid 118 run win over joint leaders Hyde, 81 from Alex Money and 77 from Andrew McFarlane taking CBH to 305. Luke Young, who returned 16-2-80-4, showed tremendous powers of stamina as well, playing a lone hand with 103, but the rest of the Hyde batting unusually failed, all out in the 43rd as Josh Leach

claimed 5-63. Nantwich rounded off a perfect league month with a typically dominant 8 wkt win at Grappenhall, wkts shared around as the hosts were all out 151 in the 39th, Marcus Stables (53\*) and Luke Robinson (49\*) helping the Dabbers coast to an 8 wkt win. Didsbury went back to the top after they made light work of an in-form Oxton side, three more wkts for Steve Green (pictured) who also assisted in the r/o of key



man Jordan Collier seeing Oxton all out 138, with Ed New man's 59\* guiding his side home. Sam Perry ended 91\* as Alderley Edge won easily at Widnes, James Naylor's earlier 5-31

seeing the hosts manage just 159 and slump to a sixth straight loss, their visit to Toft next week taking on added significance.

### **WK 9 - JUNE 17**

The top three pulled further clear and, barring some highly untoward, will be scrapping for the two Premier Division spots come September. Bowdon's fifth win in a row was another emphatic one as Joe Chapple (pictured right) tore through the Stockport Georgians line-up to leave them 15-5. It took a doughty knock from the son of another Lancs great to rescue things somewhat for Georgians, Francis Yates' 48 (102 bs) halting the slide but they could still only manage 112, John Sanders (54) paving the way for a comfortable 8 wkt win. Sale's Dan Newton again underlined his potential with a match winning 85\* (93 bs) as his side recorded an impressive 7 wkt win at Oulton Park, chasing down 229 with almost four overs in hand. A stand of 109 with Tyrone Lawrence (78) did the business, both players earlier taking a wkt apiece as Andrew Metcalf (67) and Pat Roberts (55\*) put OP in what looked a good position. Urmston's trip to Timperley started disastrously with Ryan O'Brien run out without facing second ball (pictured below), an ominous portent which saw them slide to a third defeat in a row, de-





spite Liam Marshall's 63 and 46\* from Rahul Premrajh taking them to 214-9. O'Brien did at least take an early wkt but Jonathan Fletcher's increasingly fluent 92\* made it four on the bounce for Timpers. Romiley's third successive total of 240+ didn't turn into 25 pts, their 44 overs a side game at Macclesfield ending in a draw. David Badrock's 98 helped them post 242-9, Macc replying with 194-8. Congleton got a much needed 25 pts after a 56 run win over upwardly-mobile visitors Lindow.

The hosts got away to a great start, Harry Podmore (37) and Tom Leese (49) putting on 86, but a familiar collapse saw 119-6 on the board some 11 overs later. Congleton were indebted to Arslan Dar (68\*) and Muhammad Kashif (21\*) putting on 101\* for the 7th, Dar then taking two wkts in the first over before Kashif grabbed the ball and claimed 6-35, as Cam Hawkins (85\* off 76) watched a succession of partners come and go. The meeting of the bottom two turned out to be - well, politely put, an attritional affair - which did neither Alvanley (178) or Bramhall (147-7) any favours, Steve Charles' 15-4-26-6 to no avail for Alvanley as both sides still await a second win of the season.

#### **WK8 - JUNE 11**

A fascinating end to the month saw leaders **Bowdon** downcast after a 7 wkt loss at Upcast Lane in a high scoring match with Lindow. Put in, Bowdon added 184 runs in 23 overs after drinks with Rob Lord (115\* off 101) and Tom Graham (50 off 31) added 104 in 11 overs, Lord reaching his ton with a six (pictured) as

Bowdon declared on 279-6. But Lord was upstaged by James Duffy, who batted over 3 hours for 135\*, finishing



the match with his seventh 6 as a succession of solid partnerships took the hosts to a fantastic win. Although staying top, the visit of Sale to South Downs Rd next week takes on extra significance, Sale easing to a 6 wkt win over lowly Congleton. Isaac Brooks took 6-58 as the visitors were all out 181. Pat Ashling was once more the key man, his 93 off 79 all but settling the game. Macclesfield rounded off a really encouraging June with what looked to be a tense 10 run win at

Timperley, although unfortunately no details were available at the time of writing. It was even closer at Moorside Rd where **Urmston's Ryan O'Brien** showed what a game cricket is after his game to forget the previous week. His patient 94 (162 bs) and a vital 52 from the returning Sumit Panda helped Urmston accrue 198 (although the horror collapse from 197-5 gave Stockport Georgians a real fillip). A fine opening burst from Josh Edwards saw Georgians quickly 28-4 which became a precarious 70-6, but **Francis Yates** (53) and Jordan Richards (63) added 95, Richards finally bowled by Liam Marshall with the score 190-8. Georgians inched to 196-9 after 47.4 overs before O'Brien returned to clean bowl the last man, finishing with 3-10 as Urmston won for the first time in five matches. Equal jubilation at Church Lane where **Bramhall** arrested their worrying form with a hard fought 3 wkt win over Oulton Park, who have had a June to forget. Put in, OP laboured to 175-8 on a difficult surface, Frank Farrington (30) and Pat Roberts (36) taking over 90 mins to add 67 for the 3rd

as Oliver Webb, who had a fine personal match, snared them both on his way to 4-65. Bramhall found batting no easier but skipper Nick Cantello was in resolute mood, watching his side wobbling on 123-7 but finally finding an ally in Webb, whose 26\* helped Cantello (95\*) add an unbroken 53 as Bramhall celebrated only their second win. Alvanley are still waiting to enjoy their second 25 pts after another fruitless trip across Cheshire, losing Steve Charles to the first ball of the match at Birchvale Drive as only Henry Young's 70 and 39 from Jono Whitley held up the Romiley bowlers. Isaac Willett (54) and Ans Muhammad (57\*) added a rapid 86 before skipper Tom Rolph closed out proceedings with a 30-ball 33\*, as the hosts swept to a comprehensive 9 wkt win.

Another round of games, another hundred for Marple's Grant Hodnett, whose third ton of 2023 helped his side claim a 14 run win over Mobberley in a wonderful game of cricket at Bowden Lane. Hodnett's 122 (105 bs) took the leaders to a daunting 269-4 although there were no ifs or buts about Mobb's approach - well, actually, two Butts. Osman (115 off 124 bs) & Sohaib (64 off 67) rattling off 121 at 5 an over for the opening wkt. However. Sohaib holed out, one of five victims for Joe Cash as Mobb stalled, Osman completing a fine ton but with his dismissal, Mobb went from 231-4 to 239-9, in the end were bowled out with 5 balls remaining for 255. Haslington kept up their pursuit with a very different sort of win over Port Sunlight, taking a wkt with the first ball of the match and bowling PS out for 133. 
19 June: DIDSBURY 3s 195-7 (20) beat Didsbury 4s 190-8 (20) by 5 runs
